An update from your Chairman of LINC - Roger Metcalf

We are already in the early spring and I hope everyone enjoyed the festive season over Christmas and New Year.

The Bazaar in November was a great success, raising a new record income, so I thank all those involved in helping in preparations and those working on the day. The Lucia in the Cathedral also raised more money than previous years, however we do need to try to get more people to attend, especially so on our own Lucia event. But thank you for all those who arranged it with singing and costumes, to sing in the choir and to enjoy the choir's efforts, very beautiful ones as per always!

We have not had any significant repairs to carry out and the funds of the company remain very much the same. These funds do rely heavily on the income we generate from the LiNC Operations running the catering side of our activities. The well attended Wednesday Coffee Morning takings contribute a substantial amount of the catering income. The rest of this money comes from providing coffee and cakes at concerts and other events, for instance the Heritage Groups visiting the church. This work is carried out by a very small list of our volunteers, to whom I am very grateful.

We must be aware that this is potentially a declining market and we need to consider other methods of increasing income. It would be very welcome if some more of our members can volunteer to help at the events we hold and perhaps think up new ones.

There has been much speculation in the news recently about charities. This is a suitable point to tell you about the work we have been doing to consolidate our position in the Church:

1. The ownership of the old 1883 Trust has been reconfigured to be in the control of the new Liverpool Nordic Church 1883 Trust Company, which now owns the freehold of the church and the land on which it is built.
2. In turn, LiNC now has an official 25-year, renewable, lease from the new 1883 Trust Company. Both these arrangements are recorded officially at the Land Registry. This lease gives LiNC the complete responsibility for all the running of the building, maintenance and activities.
3. The LiNC Company has, in turn, agreed a Licence with the Gustaf Adolf Nordic Congregation Company to carry out all the religious aspects of our overall responsibility to ensure that the building is used as a church, which is required by the original 1883 Trust Indenture. Thus, the congregation members can be assured that they can stay as long as they want in the building.

With this lease behind us, LiNC Company can now legally ask for grants for the building, something we have not been able to do until now.

We are now able to start to consider what work is required to repair the church leaded light windows, which is urgently required, particularly on one of the south-east facing windows. We will also be obtaining costs for the installation of a lift.

As I have said in earlier newsletters, more volunteers are needed, so if you can help, please inform me or any of the members of the board.

As always, thank you to all the people who give so generously to our charity in both terms of membership, directorship, money and time to help at our events. Thank you also for coming to our events and “using” the building. This is what it is all about – the building should not be a “museum piece” - but should be visited and loved by as many people as possible.

General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)

GDPR comes into place on 25th May 2018 and, not to bore you too much, it regulates how companies and charities such as LiNC / GANC store and use your personal information. More importantly to you it also changes the way in which we can contact you.

In the next few weeks you will receive an e-mail from us. If you wish us to continue with updates or newsletters you need to reply to the e-mail. If you do not reply, your information will be deleted and we will no longer contact you via e-mail.

The same applies if you receive information from us via the post. Therefore please remember if you wish us to continue contacting you, please OPT IN.

Dagfinn spent his married life locally, so it was fitting that his memorial service should be held in the church he loved; it was a very moving occasion.

Thanks to Ole and Vernissa for keeping the church clean and tidy, to Phil for his organ playing (how many years now, Phil?), to Mette for doing a great job with the altar flowers, and to the church council for their continued loyal support.

Loved Ones Remembered



Alf van der Hagen

Over the past few years a Norwegian corner in church as been created. To the right of the main doorway in the church hangs the Norwegian bell. Last year we hung a very special picture here too. Alf van der Hagen was the vicar in the Norwegian church during World War II and his daughter Sidsel has endeavoured to maintain special links with the church visiting us on an annual basis.

Furthermore, she has also been an active voice for Norwegian war sailors, giving speeches about their plight when they returned home to Norway.



Otto Stronstad

In November 2017 we sadly lost Otto Stronstad. Otto was a war sailor. He was on board a cargo ship in Canada when Norway was invaded. There was a unanimous decision for the sailors to join the allied forces. They sailed to Cardiff where the ship was fitted with guns. Eventually after the war he returned to and settled in Liverpool marrying Thelma. They had three children Thelma, Lindsey and Karsten. Karsten attends the coffee morning and we are glad to say is maintaining links with the church.



Olav Olsen

Olav Olsen died on 19 March 2013 he was also a war sailor. He first went to sea in 1937 as a ship's engineer. He served on Norwegian vessels throughout the war, taking part in the battle of the Atlantic whilst serving on board the M.S. Jamaica. The vessel was torpedoed and he spent 11 days in a lifeboat prior to being rescued. He returned to Norway after the war before the family settled in Liverpool. Astrid his daughter, is part of the coffee morning team and regularly volunteers with her husband Peter at events.
